The Department of English Programs at AUA offers a professional Master's of Arts in Teaching English as a Foreign Language (MA TEFL) and three Certificates: Teaching English as a Foreign Language (C-TEFL), Translation from Armenian to English and vice-versa (C-TR), and Teaching English to Young Learners (C-TEFL-YL). The curricula of these programs follow closely the requirements and standards of similar courses and degree offerings at institutions in the United States and elsewhere.

The MA TEFL is designed to meet the needs of an educational system in transition. In an era when English is regarded as the international language of business, diplomacy, scientific research, and other specialized areas of endeavor, it is imperative that the development of curricula, textbooks, examinations, and the preparation of future teachers dedicated to English language instruction be based on the most highly developed and advanced linguistic, pedagogical, and socio-cultural principles. The curriculum combines theory and practical skills providing students with an opportunity to conduct research in the field of applied linguistics and language teaching.

TEFL students have first-rate language teaching and learning facilities at their disposal, including a fully computerized language laboratory with internet access, an interactive language laboratory incorporating the use of authentic videotaped linguistic and cultural information appropriate for the development of English language skills, and the Learning Resource Center (LRC), where students can improve their English language skills on their own time with guidance from instructors.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for Admission, an applicant must meet the AUA General Admission Requirements detailed in the Admissions tab of the website at http://www.aua.am/admissions/admissions.html

In addition, MA TEFL program applicants must have the following DEPTEFL Specific Program Requirements:

- a minimum iBT (Internet-based TOEFL) score of 79
- an interest in applied linguistics research, theory, and practice expressed in the applicant's Statement of Purpose
- DEP Speaking Test (if students score low, a speaking course may be required)
